LET'S GO GREEN!

Each month we will have a section in the newsletter to add to our list of **Going Green** here at the marina. If you have any suggestions, please let me know.

We now have recycling containers for **plastic, glass and aluminum** located next to the dumpsters, in addition to our previous recycling options of **cardboard and mixed white paper**. The items that can be recycled are:

Plastic—plastic water or soda pop bottles (PET #1) HDPE #2 plastic. No other plastic is accepted.



Glass—brown and green mixed; clear bottles and jars; no light bulbs or ceramics; no window glass.

Aluminum—aluminum cans and clean foil (no food contamination); tinned cans.

Keep our marina clean. It is extremely important to understand that accidents happen, but need to be reported, so appropriate action can be taken. As a reminder, times to be particularly careful are: fueling, oil changes, any engine service. If your boat has been unattended for any length of time, look in your bilge when you get on the boat to confirm it is clean. When your bilge pump comes on, look over the side to make sure the water is clean. Don't be afraid to report an accident, it is cheaper to deal with it immediately.

Our **new items have arrived in the gift shop**. Come visit the gift shop and see the new items.

Reminder: It is a requirement that all boat owners call or email the store to **authorize vendors to work on your boat**. The vendor must check in with the marina store prior to going on the dock.

Monthly maintenance tip: Spring is a good time to check the battery banks on your boat. Especially if you have wet cell batteries. Wet cells batteries need to be checked for water level. Individual cells should be checked with a hydrometer to evaluate their charge and to compare the strength of the cells with each other. One cell with a low reading indicates a bad battery. If you have multiple batteries in your bank you should ensure that each battery is equal in strength. One bad battery will damage the entire bank. If you have two dissimilar banks you should charge them separately or ensure your system isolates them from each other. Over the years batteries, chargers and electrical systems have become much more sophisticated. Take time to learn and understand your system so if something unexpected happens you're prepared to troubleshoot and correct the problem. Don't let one bad battery spoil your summer trip!

Get a carbon monoxide warning sticker Warning stickers are required by law

By law, any new or used motor driven vessel, other than a Jet Ski type personal watercraft, must display a sticker that warns passengers of the dangers of carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning. You may use either the Washington State CO warning sticker shown above or a sticker installed by the manufacturer or another state, as long as it is approved by the Department of Licensing. The sticker must be attached to the interior of the vessel and visible to the passengers.

How to get a warning sticker

- If you already own a boat, when you renew your vessel registration or register your boat in Washington after moving to the state, you will receive a sticker and a CO warning brochure at no charge. If you don't receive a sticker when you renew or register, contact your local [vehicle licensing office](#) or call (360) 902-3812.
- **If you buy a boat from a dealer**, the dealer will attach the sticker before the transaction is completed and give you a CO warning brochure.

Where to attach the sticker

You must attach the sticker on the interior of the vessel so it is clearly visible to the passengers.

Reminder in the warm months... do NOT top off your fuel tank as the fuel expands and then comes out the overflow and into the water!

A reminder to the slip licensees that the **Moorage License Agreement** paperwork is due back at the marina July 15th. These documents need to be notarized, **signed in front of the notary**. I am a notary and will not charge for notarizing these for you, but you must be in front of me when you sign the document. The documents for the Management Agreement will be completed in July for those that want to rent out their slip or are already renting their slip out.
