Keep our marina clean. This time of year we get the occasional fuel / oil spill into the water while people are getting their boats ready for spring. It is extremely important to understand that accidents happen, but need to be reported, so appropriate action can be taken. As a reminder, times to be particularly careful are: fueling, oil changes, any engine service. If your boat has been unattended for any length of time, look in your bilge when you get on the boat to confirm it is clean. When your bilge pump comes on, look over the side to make sure the water is clean. Don't be afraid to report an accident, it is cheaper to deal with it immediately.

Cinnamon has found a new home at the Second Chance Ranch in Quilcene. After 20 years here at the marina, it was time for him to have more attention indoors. In the last three years he has spent more and more time alone upstairs. He had spent two weeks in January at the vet being checked out, they found nothing wrong other than he is getting old, but he was also losing weight. There have been instances this winter where a **boat's power** has been unplugged or turned off. The only reason this should happen is in an emergency, and the marina manager must be told immediately, so the boat owner can be contacted.

Reminder: It is a requirement that all boat owners call or email the store to **authorize vendors to work on your boat**. The vendor must check in with the marina store prior to going on the dock.

There are still a couple dinghies not claimed on the **dinghy dock**, if you have a dinghy there and are NOT being charged \$10/month, please let Diane know which one is yours. The unclaimed dinghies will be stored in the fuel yard on June 1st.

If you have storage anywhere on the marina or RV park, please let Diane know. We are cleaning up areas and I need to know what doesn't belong to the marina.

Effective with this notice, only for our long-term moorage / slip owners, there will be a **special discount on fuel**. For those of you that we don't see very often, please make sure the cashier knows you have long term moorage before they ring up your fuel sale. See the marina store for details.

Monthly maintenance tip: Check your connections on your bonding system to make sure your zincs are working for you. Sacrificial zincs won't do their job if connections inside your boat are bad.
